

“I won't hold back. I will tell you right now I loved this book. Yes, it's a book specifically aimed at people whose kids are different in some way, whether through different abilities or different emotional makeups – it is a book about hope and joy. The little firefly, Enzo, does end up on a very personal quest, sort of a ‘hero's journey’ like the late Joseph Campbell described. The pictures are adorable, expressive and colorful and complement the story perfectly. And interspersed throughout the book are the lyrics to actual songs! It reminded me of a musical where suddenly a character will burst into song to illustrate a particularly moving scene. If you care about kids and families who are struggling with disabilities or differences, you will probably love this book. It deals with denial and realism, hope and courage, inner strength and caring –and so many other real-life issues that come into play when you're the parent of a child who's different. I asked my son what he thought of the book. This is an exact quote: ‘Magical – just magical. It was a combination of fantasy and realism; it was like Warriors and a fairy tale combined.’ From beginning to end, the way the book is put together and presented, with the combination of the story, the wonderful background information, the CD and the lovely art – it's a quality book that would also make a nice gift.”
